

OF OUR LATEST CONFERENCE CONTRIBUTIONS

Presentation of IP6 "Reporting" at the Departmental Research Colloquium

On July 19, 2024, principle investigator Julia Metag and research associate Franca Singh presented their individual project on media coverage of digital self-management for chronic diseases, along with an introduction to the DISELMA research unit at the University of Münster's Department of Communication research colloquium. The presentation was well-received and sparked a lively discussion. We look forward to sharing the first results in upcoming research colloquia.

IP2 "Effects" at DGPs/ÖGP congress 2024 in Vienna

In Vienna, Alexandra Lux presented the first preliminary results from IP2: Effects' systematic meta-analytical review on the effects of mHealth use on self-management outcomes within the mobile media ecosystem. During the DGPs/ÖGP Congress, the focus was placed on a subsample of studies specifically related to Type 1 diabetes.

- Our comprehensive literature search across four databases yielded 7,779 records, with 205 studies meeting the eligibility criteria for our review.
- Diabetes dominates the sample, representing 84% of the studies; the remaining studies focused on asthma and COPD.
- The type 1 diabetes studies mainly concentrated on outcomes related to self-care behaviors and health status, neglecting behavioral determinants. → read more

DISELMA at the "Gesundheit gemeinsam" Conference in Dresden on Regional and Public Health

Natalie Rödel (IP1: Use) and principal investigator Doreen Reifegerste (on behalf of Anna-Lena Esser) (IP4: Peers) shared their research on digital chronic disease self-management. Here are our key take-aways from their talks:

- In-situ studies provide real-time data on how mobile media is used for chronic disease management, offering more precise insights compared to traditional selfreports. → read more
- Interpersonal communication within informal networks supports chronic disease self-management, though the specifics of how communication influences these behaviors need further exploration. → read more
- The ego-network method highlights how vulnerable populations access health information through key contacts, pointing to the need for more equitable health information systems. → read more
